The Community Inclusion program supports citizens to thrive in their home communities by learning how to actively and independently engage. The ideal outcome is natural relationships with other community members develops so paid supports are no longer needed.

Community Inclusion services are individualized services provided in typical integrated community settings. Paid supports provide opportunities to learn, practice, and apply skills that promote greater independence and inclusion. These supports can be complemented by individual, technical assistance and community information and education.
